Understanding Fees and CE Credits

VDOE- Local education agencies (LEA) must review and approve any course for renewal of the VDoE license held by school psychologists. VASP course offerings meet most LEA requirements; maintenance of attendance records is the responsibility of the individual, and in the case of NASP approved courses, attendance is documented as well.

NCSP Renewal - VASP is approved by the National Association of School Psychologists to offer professional development for school psychologists. VASP maintains responsibility for these programs. In addition, VPA (in conjunction with VACP) is approved by the American Psychological Association to sponsor continuing education for psychologists. Therefore credits earned in VACP sponsored courses that address one or more of the NASP domains of practice can also be used toward NCSP renewal.

Va Board of Psychology CE: Refers to courses considered eligible for CE credit by Va Board of Psychology. Most courses sponsored by VASP are eligible for Va Board of Psychology credit if content is applicable to the type of Virginia Board of Psychology license.

VACP Criteria: The Virginia Psychological Association (in conjunction with VACP) is approved by the American Psychological Association to sponsor continuing education for psychologists. The Virginia Psychological Association maintains responsibility for this program and its contents. The term VACP criteria refers to courses considered eligible for CE credit by most State Boards of Psychology. All courses listed as VACP Criteria are deemed by VPA (in conjunction with VACP) to be eligible for CE credit by Virginia Board of Psychology. VPA (and as appropriate, VACP) maintains responsibility for this program and its contents.

Fees: All must remit general registration (convention) fee, except VPA student members. If applicable, everyone must pay late fee. Fees for courses and/or CE credits are clearly stated for each course and offset costs for promotion, attendance documentation, meeting room rental and audio visual.

A number of courses have "no fee" or are listed as "free" for those registered. Some "free" courses may offer CE credit. If a "free" course offers CE credit, you must indicate on registration form that you desire CE credit. In some cases, "free" courses require an extra fee when CE credit is requested.

All VACP criteria courses require fee payment. No "audit" for free permitted for VACP criteria workshops. *Most VACP courses which offer VACP criteria for CE credit (deemed by VPA/VACP) include CE credit for VA Board of Psychology.*

CE Verification:

- To obtain CE credit, registrant must receive perforated card for that course.
- Registrant must make sure name and address are clearly printed on top AND bottom of card.
- At end of course, course monitor must stamp top portion of card which remains with registrant as proof of attendance. No additional "certificates" will be mailed.
- Bottom half of course card **MUST** be left with classroom monitor at conclusion of course which will be returned to VPA for file. Failure to leave bottom half of course card with monitor nullifies CE credit.
- No partial credit for any course will be given. To obtain credit you must attend the ENTIRE course, attendance will be monitored.

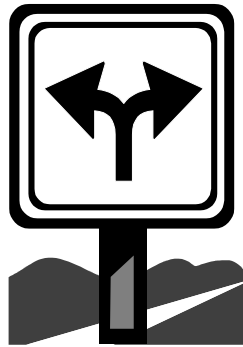

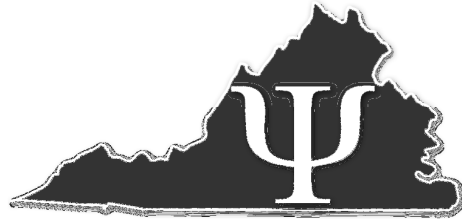
