This session will focus on the increasing diversity of U.S. public schools, educational services for dual-language learners, understanding first and second language acquisition, generational effects in language development, history of immigrant achievement, parallel processes in development, and language development, legal compliance in assessment of diverse children and a framework for comprehensive nondiscriminatory assessment. Dr. Ortiz will also be here to provide an introduction and answer questions about the ORTIZ Picture Vocabulary Acquisition Test (PVAT). This is a fully digital test that provides fair and accurate assessment of receptive vocabulary ability for English speakers and English learners."

Session will cover bilingual assessment vs. assessment of bilinguals, use of interpreters in assessment, current research in support of the Culture-Language Test Classifications (C-LTC) and Interpretive Matrix (C-LIM), examples of test- specific classification matrices, and case study illustrations of nondiscriminatory interpretation with the C-LIM.
